This December, get ready to step into a world of wonder, sparkle and festive fun as Next Door But One brings a brand new play to life, bursting with music, puppets, and glitter.

Something feels a little different this year... The snow has fallen, the winter stars are twinkling, but the sparkle of Christmas seems to be missing. Can two friends, facing big changes like moving house, starting new schools and a first Christmas without grandma, find the magic again?

With the help of a magical robin, they're whisked away on a joyful journey through their favourite Christmas memories! From festive food and colourful fairy lights, to joyful songs and thoughtful gifts, they soon discover that the real sparkle of Christmas isn't found under the tree — it's in the laughter, love and unforgettable moments we share together and that can live forever in our hearts.

When Robins Appear will be a heart-warming, high-energy show created especially for KS2 students. Role.

The script is currently in R&D and will only be finalised once the full cast is formed. The show is a three-hander and will include multi-roling. 2 of the actors have already been cast and we are therefore casting for the remaining actor; roles will be assigned when casting is complete, and possibly within the rehearsal process. We are therefore looking for an actor who enjoys multiroling (playing a 12 year old to a grandparent!), thrives in a collaborative process, has a child-like energy, who is a confident singer and has experience in children's theatre.

We are particularly interested in meeting Disabled, LGBTQ+ and Global Majority actors.

Due to the local touring model we are looking to cast an actor based in York, has a base in York or is within commutable distance.

Fees are based on £610 per week, plus additional payments for extra days, longer calls or other amendments to scheduling (such as shortened lunch breaks).

Application process

Please send a self tape of:

- The following script (reading either role).
- You singing an upbeat childrens/pop/christmas song that demonstrates your voice/range (1 minute max)

Send this along with your CV/spotlight (or similar) and a short statement as to why this role/production is of interest to you, to hello.ndb1@gmail.com by 10am on Sunday 7th September 2025

If you are shortlisted for an audition, we will contact you by Friday 12th September.

The auditions will be held in York on <u>Wednesday 1st October</u>. (please note: these will be group/workshop auditions)

Notes on self tape: We are not looking at your filming skills or your set up, we just want to see and hear how you would approach the script, character, and singing. However you want to incorporate the lines of the character opposite you is up to you - have someone read in off camera, pre-record the other lines, leave gaps where the other line is. We'd prefer self tapes to be sent as files, Youtube links (or similar) or cloud storage links (e.g. Gdrive) as platforms like WeTransfer have expiration dates and we would hate to miss out on downloading your self tape(s).

Side for Self Tape (read either Ellis or Lowen - both 12 year old)

Ellis: Watch where you're going, will ya?!

Lowen: And a Merry Christmas to you too.

Ellis: Oh and you can stop it with that as well.

Ellis: All that 'Merry Christmas' stuff. It's not gonna be, OK?

Lowen: OK, yes, I know!

Ellis: No you don't.

Lowen: Yeh right.

Ellis: Prove it.

Lowen: What?

(pause)

Ellis: We've just moved, so our house is just full of boxes.

Lowen: Yeh, so is mine, but it's my Gran's old stuff.

Ellis: There's no decorations anywhere.

Lowen: We can't even find our decorations!

Ellis: I can't find any of my things.

Lowen: My dad keeps giving our things away to charity shops.

Ellis: I miss all my friends from where I used to live.

Lowen: I really miss my Gran.

Ellis: I'm worried about starting a new school in January.

Lowen: I'm worried about my dad.

Ellis: I'm worried about my mum. All the time.

Lowen: I'm really sad

Ellis: I'm more sad!

(pause)

Lowen: Are we seriously arguing about who's got the worst Christmas?

Ellis: I guess so...

(they laugh a bit)

Lowen: I'm Lowen.

Ellis: I'm Ellis.

Lowen: OK then. Well. Merry...

(Ellis gives a look to Lowen)

Lowen: Have... a... 'not so bad December'

Ellis: Yeh. You too.
