This winter, get ready to step into a world of wonder, sparkle and festive fun as Next Door But One brings a brand new play to life, bursting with music and glitter.

Something feels a little different this year... The snow has fallen, the winter stars are twinkling, but the sparkle of Christmas seems to be missing. Can two friends, facing big changes like moving house, starting new schools and a first Christmas without grandma, find the magic again?

Role.

Lowen:

A 12 year old who is navigating their first Christmas without their Gran who they loved dearly. They are trying to understand these feelings, learn how to talk to their dad about it whilst still trying to keep the joy and memory of their Gran alive. They are hopeful, energetic, yet often naive. They are quick to join in with anything fun and imaginative.

Notes on casting:

- Female presenting.
- Playing age of 12 (doesn't need to look 12 just confident to play this and have a childlike energy).
- Strong singing voice.
- Confident mover and able to learn choreography.

We are particularly interested in meeting Disabled, LGBTQ+ and Global Majority actors.

Due to the local touring model we are looking to cast an actor based in York, has a base in York or is within commutable distance.

This will be a busy tour, with an acting team of 3 and a stage manager. We are looking for an enthusiastic team player, willing to help with get-ins and get outs. Experience touring into schools (particularly SEND settings) and non-theatre venues would be desirable.

Fee

Fees are based on £610 per week, plus additional payments for extra days, longer calls or other amendments to scheduling (such as shortened lunch breaks), and travel whilst on tour.

Application process

Please send a self tape of:

- The following side to camera.
- You singing an upbeat childrens/pop/christmas song that demonstrates your voice/range (30 seconds-1 minute max)

If you are shortlisted for an audition, we will contact you by the end of Wednesday 19th August

Auditions will be held as a workshop in small groups. Further details of this will be sent to those who are shortlisted.

Notes on self tape: We are not looking at your filming skills or your set up, we just want to see and hear how you would approach the script, character, and singing. We've made the side as short as possible, but we don't expect you to learn it - reading from the page for your self tape is absolutely fine with us! We'd prefer self tapes to be sent as files, Youtube links (or similar) or cloud storage links (e.g. Gdrive) as platforms like WeTransfer have expiration dates and we would hate to miss out on downloading your self tape(s).

Side for Self Tape - Lowen
