The Role

Dates of contract: 24th Nov - 21st Dec, with some additional meetings beforehand (depending on availability)

Location: York

Pay: £610.00 per week plus travel (if applicable)

Key Tasks and Responsibilities:

- Compile the 'book' during rehearsals and draw up daily rehearsal notes and distribute to the production team.
- Work with the Company Manager and Director to draw up rehearsal and touring schedules and distribute updated daily rehearsal calls in advance of the next working day
- Keep a clear record of any script changes and communicate these to the wider team.
- Assist the Designer with any shopping for props etc. (The bulk of the propping will be done in advance of rehearsals starting).
- Draw up a plan for technical rehearsals with input from the production team and lead the technical rehearsal sessions.



- Taking the lead on planning for the for the get in/ fit up/get out at each venue and then leading at each venue to ensure it is carried out efficiently and safely.
- Operate sound as required during performances.
- Compile and distribute show reports & complete the NDB1 Activity log for each performance.

Skills and Experience:

Essential:

- Experience of an SM role on one or more shows at professional level.
- familiarity with creating SM paperwork,
- Experience of supporting creatives and cast in a rehearsal room.
- Strong communication skills: confident to engage with cast, director and wider creative team as well as staff at venues.

Desirable

- Experience of working on get ins, fit ups and get outs, (not essential)
- Experience of working in and touring to non traditional theatre venues
- Driver's license and happy to transport set/props

Please note that there is scope for mentorship within the role from NDB1 company members.
